USA Health Masking Policy

USA Health Masking Protocol

Red Status - Masks are required in all patient care areas of USA Health when community Covid-19 rates are high.

Green Status - Masks are optional in all patient care areas of USA Health when community Covid-19 rates

Appropriate masking and PPE is required for patients who are on respiratory or other types of isolation precautions-See table below

Unvaccinated employees are required to wear masks in patient care areas.

Failure to comply with the masking protocol may result in progressive discipline up to and including termination.

NOTICE: Masks with exhalation vents are **NOT** appropriate PPE for the hospital setting and are **NOT** to be worn as PPE in any USA Health facility.

NOTE: This policy is based on community positivity rates of ≤10% and are subject to change as conditions warrant.
