

VANIFICATION What to expect at your vaccine appointment

When you arrive for vaccination, you will enter on Claiborne Street. You will need to have your photo
ID available as you go through a series of checkpoints.
You will stay in your car for the entire process while you are at the Civic Center Arena. The average
time it takes to complete the process is about 1 hour to 1.5 hours. Please plan accordingly.
At your first checkpoint, we will check your ID to ensure we have your information on the schedule.
We will notify our team you are here, so they can start preparing for your visit.
At your second checkpoint, you will receive the Pfizer Emergency Use Authorization Fact Sheet for
vaccine recipients. We are required to give you this before you receive the vaccine. You also will
receive information on how to opt-in to the CDC V-Safe monitoring app. The app will text you each
day for 1 week, so you can report side effects to the CDC.
You will then enter the tunnel that leads into the Civic Center Arena.
 Once you enter the Arena, you will be directed by staff to enter a lane to receive your vaccination. Our
staff will review your completed consent form with you and then will administer the vaccine in your
upper arm. A timer will be placed on your vehicle and started once the vaccine is given.
 After your vaccination, you will be directed to our medical observation area. Staff will visit your car to
complete your appointment check-out, as well as provide educational information on what to expect
after you receive your vaccination. Your check-out process will include scheduling your follow-up
booster dose in 3 weeks, as well as taking pictures of your photo ID and insurance card if needed.
We will monitor you for at least 15 minutes to ensure you tolerate the vaccine without any difficult
breathing. We have nurses, healthcare providers and emergency medical personnel on-site to
assess you and provide any assistance.
After your monitoring and check-out is completed, you will be directed by staff to exit the monitoring
station. If you provided a mobile device, USA Health will send you a text each day for 1 week to allow
you to report any significant side effects. We will review that information daily and will attempt to call
you if needed.
